

HUMAN AND SOCIAL BIOLOGY

The Human and Social Biology (HSB) course is based on the prescribed syllabus of the Caribbean Examination Council and requires about two years of study for its completion. The intention of this course is to certify successful candidates writing the CSEC Examination with a general proficiency pass in the Caribbean Secondary Education Certificate (CSEC).

The journey of the syllabus includes the delivery of HSB theory through various strategies including hands-on, model building, simulation, role-play, drama, readings, practicum, field trips, and visits to science fairs and exhibitions as well as the use of Information Technology.

The course of study will engage Cadets not only in the set theory component of the Human and Social Biology syllabus but in a variety of enrichment topics relating to the socio-scientific field, such as health issues, space information, new inventions, technology and innovation.

At the end of the two years, Cadets will perform successfully at the CSEC Examination. They will graduate from the academy with a superior insight into the interdependence of man with the universe and with the other life forms present. They will also develop an understanding and knowledge of the human body regarding its form and functions.

The Cadets will be well informed individuals who will practise healthy life styles and who will make informed decisions relating to their own health issues. They will also be equipped to proceed to access higher education and training.
